- 153. The **Monroe Doctrine** was a foreign policy statement delivered by President James Monroe stating that the U.S. would not interfere in European affairs, and that the western hemisphere was closed to colonization and/ or interference by European nations.
- 154. The **Treaty of Paris of 1763** ended the French and Indian War and effectively kicked the French out of North America.
- 155. The Treaty of Paris of 1763 ended the American Revolution and forced Britain to recognize the United States as an independent nation.
- 156. The Northwest Ordinance was a policy of establishing the principles and procedures for the orderly expansion of the United States.
