


# What are transition words?

Transition words are words that show the reader the relationship between phrases, sentences or even paragraphs. Transition words make it more natural for readers to know how thoughts and ideas are related. They also prepare the reader for what's coming in the next sentences.



## TRANSITION WORDS

*Transition words serve to establish logical connections between the sentences, paragraphs, and sections of the proposal. Effective transitions enable the themes, strength statements, important features, and customer benefits to flow together.*

## The Role Of Transitional Words

1. Transition words show the flow between phrases, sentences or paragraphs.
2. They improve readability and text structure.
3. Transition words make it easier to read and understand a text.
4. They show how thoughts and ideas are interconnected.
5. They can help readers to understand the logic of your writing
6. They also prepare readers for what is coming next.

Cause And Effect	Accordingly	The last place team went bankrupt and is no longer part of the competition. We've adjusted the tables <b>accordingly</b> .
Cause And Effect	As a result	He forgot to water the plants. <b>As a result</b> , they died.
Cause And Effect	Consequently	The prisoner didn't behave well. <b>Consequently</b> , the guards have decided to put him in isolation.

Contrast	Despite	<b>Despite</b> his reservations, they decided to move abroad.

Contrast	However	I've done my best. <b>However</b> , it seems that just wasn't enough.

Contrast	Whereas	He's very prickly, <b>whereas</b> she's more easygoing.

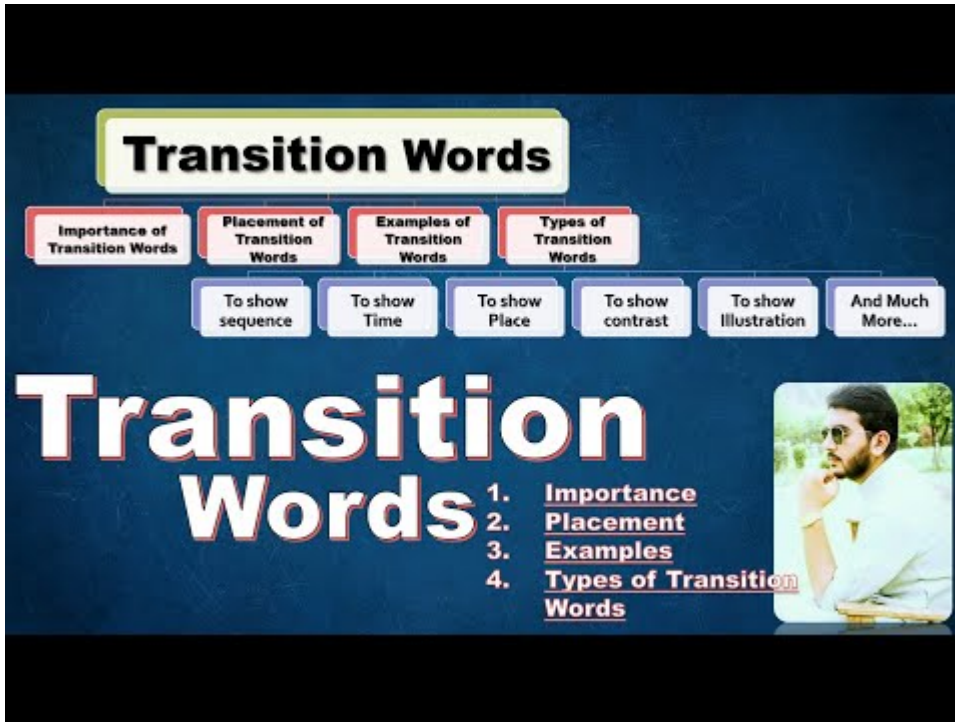
Contrast	While	<b>While</b> I haven't checked the stats, she seems to be having a great game.
Contrast	Yet	He was advised against taking up fencing. <b>Yet</b> , he decided to go for it.
<b>Example</b>	For example	Advertisements aren't always completely honest. <b>For example</b> , the campaigns claiming milk to be essential mainly served the goal of getting rid of excess milk farmers were stuck with.
Example	For instance	In the evening, I like to relax. <b>For instance</b> , I enjoy watching TV.
Example	To demonstrate	Frogs are very difficult to catch. <b>To demonstrate</b> , I've released eight of them in this room. Good luck, everyone!
Emphasis	Above all	There are many reasons to exercise regularly. <b>Above all</b> , it keeps you healthy.

<b>Time</b>	After that	I'll start by telling you what transition words are. <b>After that</b> , I'll tell you why you should always use them.
Time	All of a sudden	Things seemed to be going so well. <b>All of a sudden</b> , though, they told us they were going to break up.
Time	As long as	I won't put up with this anymore. <b>As long as</b> you're part of this team, I'm out.
Time	Before	When I moved out, I realized how much my parents did for me. I didn't even think about stuff like that <b>before</b> .
Time	During	His collapse was unprecedented. <b>During</b> the first part of the race, he seemed like the absolute favorite to win!

Time	Meanwhile	Harry was practicing his skills. <b>Meanwhile</b> , Carrie was out looking for trouble.
Time	Subsequently	First we tried to play nice. <b>Subsequently</b> , we concluded that a more direct approach was the way to go.
<u>Similarity</u>	In the same vein	I always try to be respectful. <b>In the same vein</b> , she very humbly asked the professor to repeat what he'd said because she didn't quite catch it.
Similarity	Likewise	John is always hell-bent on doing what's right. <b>Likewise</b> , Mary tries to live her life as best she can.
Similarity	Similarly	She tried really hard to entertain her guests. <b>Similarly</b> , he put all his heart and soul in cooking a great dinner.
<u>Summarize/Conclude</u>	All things considered / all in all /, as shown above, / as can be seen / as has been noted	She's been very driven, and she's inspired others to work hard as well. <b>All things considered</b> , I think she's lead the project very well.
Summarize/Conclude	In conclusion / in summary	<b>In conclusion</b> , transition words are an important aspect of SEO copywriting.
Summarize/Conclude	In short / in brief	He's handsome, courteous and he dresses very well. <b>In short</b> , he's Prince charming!
Summarize/Conclude	Ultimately	It was pretty fun to do, but a lot of work as well. <b>Ultimately</b> , I'm pretty happy this thing is over with.

**Conclusively.** Transition words are very significant for the readability of any piece of text. **However**, numerous people struggle with them. If you do, study them the aforementioned list thoroughly and make sure you also practice a lot. **In addition**, make sure you're aware of the structure of the text. **In this way**, it will be easier to pick the best transition words available on the spot.
